Market Commentary

WOOL MARKET STRENGTHENS

Port Elizabeth - The wool market was dearer at this week's sale and the Cape Wools Merino indicator gained 1,9% to close at R115,55/kg (clean). This is 3,5% up compared to the opening sale of this season and 6,3% up compared to the corresponding sale of the previous season. On the Australian market, the indicator increased with 2,0%. The Cape Wools All-Wool Indicator gained 3,1%.

Local traders attribute the dearer prices to increasingly positive market sentiment. The limited supply of good quality Merino wool benefited prices and resulted in strong competition in the sale room between all buyers of the trade. The Rand on the day traded 0,1% stronger at R12,07 against the US dollar, compared with last week's average rate, and weakened 1,3% against the Euro at R12,98. The offering comprised of 5 501 bales of which 99% was sold. Major traders were Lempriere SA (1 824), G Modiano SA (1 359) and Standard Wool SA (1 200).

The weekly price monitor sample, limited to AWEX type MF5, 70-80mm, VM<=2% wool only, experienced an average price movement as follows: 18 microns were down by 0,8% to close at R124,72/kg, 18,5 microns strengthened by 0,9% to R122,97/kg, 19 microns gained 0,4% to close at R118,10/kg, 19,5 microns rose with 3,1% to close at R118,10/kg, 20 microns gained 1,2% to close at R114,55/kg, 20,5 microns increased with 2,0% to close at R114,23/kg, 21 microns gained 2,5% to close at R113,22/kg, 21,5 microns strengthened by 2,7% to R110,60/kg and 22 microns rose with 3,5% to close at R111,46/kg.

The next sale is scheduled for 29 April where approximately 8 900 bales will be on offer.
