Market Commentary

WOOL MARKET INCREASES

Port Elizabeth - The wool market performed very well at this week's sale and the C ape Wools Merino indicator gained 5,3% to close at R121,68/kg (clean). This is 9,0% higher compared to the opening sale of this season and 4,8% higher compared to the corresponding sale of the previous season. On the Australian market, the indicator increased with 0,7%. The Cape Wools All-Wool Indicator gained 3,7%.

The market increased substantially also when measured in US Dollars. Strong demand from China and the approaching close of the season drove this market increase. Traders commented that a large percentage of the offering consisted of medium and short wool with little good quality long Merino wool on offer.

The Rand on the day traded 1,9% stronger at R11,84 against the US dollar, compared with last week's average rate, and weakened 0,3% against the Euro at R13,03. The offering comprised of 9 026 b ales of which 97% was sold. Major traders were G Modiano SA (2 546), Standard Wool SA (2 438), Lempriere SA (1 803) and Stucke n & Co (1 080).

The weekly price monitor sample, limited to AWEX type MF5, 70-80mm, VM<=2% wool only, experienced an average price movement as follows: 18 microns were up by 4,9% to close at R130,8 8/kg, 18,5 microns strengthened by 6,4% to R130,88/kg, 19 microns gained 5,5% to close at R124,65/kg, 19,5 microns rose with 5,2% to close at R124,26/kg, 20 microns gained 7,1% to close at R122,63/kg, 20,5 microns increased with 4,5% to close at R119,4 2/kg, 21 microns gained 6,5% to close at R120,55/kg, 21,5 microns strengthened by 6,1% to R117,36/kg and 22 microns rose with 4,2% to close at R116,19/kg.
