## **Market Commentary**

## **WOOL MARKET 2,0% LOWER**

Port Elizabeth - The wool market traded 2,0% lower this week and the Cape Wools Merino Indicator decreased by 286 points to close at a value of R143,63 (Clean). On the Australian market, the EMI decreased 2,5%. The Cape Wools All Wool Indicator lost 2,4%.

The finer end of the market today again trumped the coarser end with good demand for wool across the board. Large volumes of wool were on offer this week and despite their shipping woes the buyers competed gallantly to secure their clients orders.

This week saw the Rand at R13,54 to the US dollar. The rand weakened by 0,5% against the US dollar compared with the average rate at the previous sale. The Rand lost 1,1% against the Euro, trading at R15,09. The offering comprised of 11 549 bales of which 94,4% was sold. Major traders were Standard Wool SA (4 837), G Modiano SA (3 547), Lempriere SA (1 183) and Stucken & Co (749).

The average clean prices for the selection within the different micron categories for good top-making (MF5), long fleeces were as follows: 18,0 microns lost 0,6% to close at R165,87/kg; 18,5 microns decreased 0,2% to close at R162,71/kg; 19 microns decreased 2,4% to close at R156,93/kg; 19,5 microns lost 2,4% to close at R150,27/kg; 20 microns decreased with 2,3% to close at R142,43/kg; 20,5 microns decreased 2,4% to close at R138,05/kg; 21,0 microns lost 3,5% to close at R134,50/kg; 21,5 microns dropped 3,0% to close at R135,16/kg; 22,0 microns declined 0,7% to close at R133,18/kg and 22,5 microns dropped 3,6% to close at R133,26/kg.

The next sale is scheduled for 16 November 2016 where approximately ±14 654 bales will be on sale.
