Market Commentary

WOOL MARKET RECOVERS

PORT ELIZABETH: This week's sale saw the market recouping some of its losses of the previous week and Cape Wools' Merino indicator rose 2,4% to close at R59,07/kg (clean).

Continued keen demand from China and a slightly weaker rand provided the necessary impetus for the market to improve and the prices of most quality, long fleeces were higher.

The rand, at R7,39, was down 1,1% against the US dollar compared with last week's exchange rate, while it was 0,5% weaker against the euro at R11,03.

Grease wool exporters were strong in the market, supported by local processors. A high sales percentage was obtained when 99% of the 11 058 bales on offer changed hands.

Major buyers were Standard Wool SA (3 716 bales); Modiano (3 583 bales); Lempriere SA (1 532 bales), and Stucken (1 131 bales).

Average prices for good topmaking (MF5), sound, long fleeces (less than 1% seed content) were as follows: 19 microns rose 3,4% to R70,59/ kg; 19,5 microns were up 0,6% to R65,35/kg; 20 microns gained 1,1% to R62,52; 20,5 microns were 2,8% dearer at R60,89; 21 microns rose 3,2% to R60,22/kg; 21,5 microns gained 5,2% to R59,79/kg, and 22 microns were up 3,6% to close at R58,40/kg.

About 8 500 bales will be offered at next week's sale.
