Market Commentary

MARKET CLOSES ON A SOFTER NOTE

PORT ELIZABETH: With the business climate expected to remain tough during the weeks before the Christmas recess, it was no surprise to see a further decline in the market with with Cape Wools' Merino indicator softening by 3,4% to close at R42,64/kg (clean).

However, with the strengthening of the rand by 6% against the US dollar and 5% against the euro compared with last week's sale, this decline was relatively mild.

Although orders for wool are reportedly still slow to come in, a satisfactorily sales percentage was also achieved when 93% of the 9 868 bales on offer was cleared to the trade.

Major buyers were Chargeurs Wool (2 261 bales); Standard Wool (1 779 bales); Modiano (1 645 bales), and Segard Masurel (1 543 bales).

Prices of long Merino fleeces of AWEX types 4 and 5 were generally softer across the full micron range, with the finer qualities posting relatively larger declines compared with the medium qualities.

Approximately 9 500 bales will come under the hammer at next week's sale.
