Market Commentary

PRICES UP DESPITE STRONGER CURRENCY

The wool market put up a solid performance for a second week in a row despite another sharp increase in the value of the rand and Cape Wools' Merino indicator gained 0,7% to close at R46,52/g (clean).

This means that the indicator has gained 5,5% since the last sale in February, but still is down 33% on the same sale in March 2008.

The rand, at R9,53, was 3,1% stronger against the US dollar compared with last week's average exchange rate, but at R12,83, was unchanged against the euro.

There was keen demand for the relatively small offering of 7 213 bales, which supported the market. The fact the the rand was was 5,3% weaker against the Australian dollar may also have contributed to the strong demand.

A sales percentage of 96% was obtained and the major buyers were Standard Wool SA (1 902 bales); Modiano (1 609 bales); Stucken (1 125 bales); Lempriere SA (943 bales), and Segard Masurel (603 bales).

Average prices for AWEX types MF4 and MF 5 (70 mm to 80 mm) were as follows: 19 microns were down 1,8% to R59,16/kg; 20 microns softened 0,6% to R50,34/kg; 21 microns gained 2,6% to R48,24/kg; 22 microns rose 2,3% to R48,72/kg, and 23 microns were up 1,4% to R48,21/kg.

No sale has been scheduled for next week. Sales will resume on 8 April when 11 500 bales will be offered.
