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Market Commentary

MARKET FEELS EFFECT OF STRONGER RAND

PORT ELIZABETH: Currency fluctuations continued to affect the market. At the previous sale two weeks ago, a weak currency helped to lift the market to its highest levels in four years. This week the market had to contend with a stronger rand and Cape Wools' overall indicator fell 3.9% to R40.28/kg (clean).

The rand was 2,6% firmer against the US dollar at R7,27 and up 1,5% against the euro at R9,71 compared with the previous sale. The Australian market was also down as a result of a stronger dollar, which in turn put further pressure on the local market.

The local indicator nevertheless managed to stay above the key R40/kg level and currently is up 33% on the opening sale.

A total of 11 998 bales was offered of which 93% changed hands. Major buyers were SA Wool Exporters (2 422 bales), Stucken (2 140 bales), Chargeurs Wool (1 593 bales), Segard Masurel (1 532 bales) and Modiano (1 421 bales).

Average price movements for AWEX-type fleeces MF3, MF4 and MF5 of 70 and 80 mm were as follows: 19 microns dropped 3,8% at R65,27/kg; 20 microns were down 3,8% at R59,11/kg; 21 microns shed 4,1% at R56,36/kg; 22 microns were 5,2% cheaper at R55,08/kg, 23 microns softened 4,6% at R53,29/kg, but there were no quotes for 24 and 25 microns.


There will be no sales over the next two weeks. Sales will resume on 18 April when approximately 11 000 bales will be offered.

Industry News

Big fall in Aussie production forecasted

The full impact of the 2006 drought in Australia will become evident over the next six months when wool production is expected to drop sharply, according to the latest release by the Australian Wool Innovation Production Forecasting Committee.

The committee predicts that for the last four months of the 2006/07 season, shorn wool production and broker receipts will decline by 20% to 25% on average, with Australian shorn wool production falling to 425 million kilograms (greasy) for the full season.

Although supply (auction offerings) has been robust, this was largely as a result of shearings brought forward and the release of on-farm held grower stocks. *Source: Australian Wool Innovation and FarmOnline*
