## **Market Commentary**

## **SLIGHT INCREASE IN WOOL PRICES**

Port Elizabeth: This week's sale saw prices improving slightlythom previous sale a fortnight ago and the Cape Wools Merino itodiograined 0,5% to close at R113,83/kg (clean).

Traders report reluctance from some clients to buy at currentslewhile demand from other areas remains firm.

The rand was fairly unchanged against the US dollar, trading atværnage rate of R8,82, which was up a negligible 0,1% on the agreement at the previous sale, while at R11,96, it had gained 1,1% against the eur

It was a fairly large offering of 12 891 bales and a sales peagenof 99% was achieved.

Major buyers were Modiano SA (3 701 bales) and Stucken & Co (2b20es), Lempriere SA (2 778 bales), and Standard Wool (2 217spale

Wool receipts at the brokers to date are up 10% compared with the sponding period last season. The accumulative figure suggests rease in the volume Merino wool offered, which was up 8,4% compared with season, while wool volumes from other breeds increased lyy0o7f%. This seems to indicate that the Merino remains a firm favourith wool producers..

Most quality fleece wool types were slightly dearer with the agerprice for good topnaking types of 19 microns gaining almost 2%. The average clean prices for the different categories goodnating (MF5), long fleeces were as follows: 18 microns were downight 0,4% at R126,69/kg, 18,5 microns gained 0,5% at R125,17/kg, 19 microns were at R123,26/kg, 19,5 microns gained 0,6% to R119g220k microns were up by a marginal 0,2% at R114,73/kg, 20,5 microns bys1,7% to R113,51/kg, 21 microns increased by 0,9% to R112g020/k,5 microns were 0,9% dearer at R111,56/kg, and 22 microns rose 0,55% at R111,63/kg.

Approximately 7 500 bales will be on offer at next week's sale.
